Trade Facts What sort of training do you need?

To become a Bicycle Technician usually requires the completion of an Australian Apprenticeship in Automotive Bicycle Mechanics. The length of the training can vary and may involve on-the-job and off-the-job components. The off-the-job training is provided through Registered Training Organisations to the Certificate III level. You may be able to start training for this occupation while still at school.

Smart Move

Bicycle Technicians may progress to positions such as business manager, workshop foreman or technical officer, tool or equipment manufacturer, racing team mechanic, sales manager or bicycle component designer.
